

Voisey's Brook and Rainbow Gully Parks

There has been a great deal of progress on Rainbow Gully Park. The huts are moving along nicely and the landscape is starting to shape up. It is certainly a large project that will take time before the finished product is visible. The relocation of the playground will be taking place very soon, but, there is a delay in the artificial turf. It now looks like the field will be ready late September or early October. The hut in Voisey's Brook has also seen some delays, but, rest assured it will be completed before the end of the year. A Green and Clean PCSP

The residents of PCSP inspire us every day with their passion for protecting the environment and beauty of our community. The Public Works Department is consistently improving our programs and services to meet our residents expectations. This year they are introducing two such projects:

Ditching Project

In the first week of July, we will be starting the cleanout of town ditches. This project will be broken down into zones, the same as the garbage routes. The project will run from July until the end of September, and will commence the following year on the same date. This process will take four years, with one zone per year being completed. Once complete, they will be maintained over



that same four year schedule permanently.

Waste Management Program

The Town is committed to reducing the amount of waste in our community and landfills, while making waste disposal as time and cost effective as possible for our residents. This year we have initiated a couple of these strategies, however, the entire waste management program will not roll out until this fall, when our new Town Waste Management Program commences, including a curbside recycling program. At that time we are enthusiastic that you will find a holistic and responsible approach to waste management in Portugal Cove - St. Philip's.

As always, we appreciate your feedback and look forward to working on these initiatives with our residents input in the future.

A building permit is required for all accessory buildings constructed or brought onto the property (ex. prefab/constructed off-site) within the Town.

The Pumas went undefeated through round-robin play before defeating Holy Family Elementary in the Finals 53-36.
