Local Councillor Appointed to Leadership Committee

Councillor Moses Tucker was recently appointed to the Leadership Committee for the Northeast Avalon Regional Plan. The role of the Committee is five fold: to identify the goals and objectives of the regional plan; to report back to each member's respective municipality, to approve and oversee the public consultation process; to provide municipal feedback, and to recommend approval of the completed regional plan to the Minister.
