Wood Heat Safety

With the cold weather here and winter fast approaching, the Town would like residents to exercise extra caution when lighting wood fires in their homes. The Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) recommends the following safety tips when fire is a source of heat in your home, cabin or otherwise.

You may be forced to use wet wood. It is hard to light, slow to burn and provides much less heat than dry wood.

• Here's how to make the best of an emergency situation...

· Because small pieces heat up and catch fire faster, split the wood into pieces about 3 in diameter.

- · Brush snow and ice off the wood and bring it into the house, don't store it too close to the stove.
- · Burn small, bright fires, using no more than five small sticks at a time.
- If you have some dry wood, mix it with the wet wood.
- · Never load up the stove or fireplace and let it smoulder.

Safety tip

 If you have a battery-operated smoke detector, make sure that it works. If you don't have one, try to install one. A battery operated carbon monoxide alarm is also useful.

· Check materials around the stove/fireplace and all exposed parts of chimney, including the attic, for signs of overheating. Wood starts to darken as it overheats.

 Make sure all flue pipe joints are fastened with at least three sheet metal screws.

· Burn small, bright fires to make the most effective use of the fuel, while avoiding the overheating from large, intense fires.

• Don't try to heat the whole house; focus all your activities in the room where the heater is and let other rooms go cold; drain your water pipes and pumps.

· Shovel ashes into a metal container, take it outside immediately and empty it in the yard away from trees and shrubs; never put a bucket full of ashes in the basement or on a wooden porch floor, and never put ashes in a wood /cardboard box.

• If the stove continues to smoke, open a nearby window.

· If you can't keep the unit from smoking, stop using it because you and your family could suffer carbon monoxide poisoning.

• If you are using a wood burning furnace, remove the blower compartment door and open the basement door; burn small, controlled fires.

What's going on in Portugal Cove - St. Philip's

he Town weathered the storm relatively easy, when you look at many communities around the province, from the affects of Hurricane Igor. Luckily, there was no lasting damage to structures that were flooded in the Town. Most flooding happened in flood planes, where they exist in low lying areas. Even though a number of residents had severe flooding, no structures, town owned or private were destroyed. The Public Works Department focused their efforts on keeping roads clear of debris and making sure culverts and bridges drained water as effectively as they could. Most were at capacity. Bridges that were flooded out, such as Loop Drive, suffered no permanent damages. We are using data collected after the storm to use toward planning better water management systems and we are applying for water

management funding. The Town has already been in touch with Municipal Affairs about potential damage funding.

Residents are advised that the Town will be renting a wood chipper to take care of any trees or branches from the hurricane. Please phone the Town at 895-8000, if you have trees/ branches for pickup. Because most rental equipment is still busy, the pick up will take place over the next 2-4 weeks, however residents should have residual brush/debirs kept at your regular garbage pick-up location for collection as early as Saturday, November 6th.
