## **Rainbow Gully Park Vandalised**

Security cameras are still being reviewed to identify those involved and residents are encouraged to call the Town Hall if they have any information. Additional security infrastructure for our parks had been planned for installation when they were completed, but, now security will be pushed up.

There are two bulk garbage pick-ups each year and Robin Hood Bay Waste Management Facility is only a few kilometers away.

## 2012 – A Year to Remember: Mayor's Message

This Newsletter takes us to the end of the year - a year that seems to have flown. Council and staff have been very busy. Work is moving along on Rainbow Gully Park, which will be a state of the art facility. We will have completed work at the Neary's Pond swimming area, the Emma Churchill Dawson



Seniors' Memorial Park (near the fish plant), and West Point Cemetery. Work on the East Coast Trail from Bauline to Portugal Cove Harbour has begun. We have funding for upgrades to Voisey's Brook Park, and were able to secure 100 acres of crown land to add to that park. Work is about to begin on upgrading Loop Drive, North Point Road, Hanlon's Road, Knight's Rest, and Thorburn Road to the St. Philip's marina. We have received funding for upgrades to Hardings Hill, replacement of Hardings Hill Bridge, and extending water/sewer up Thorburn Road to the Town Hall area. This is where we hope the new school will be built and our planned lifestyle center with swimming pool. Housing development still continues at a fast pace. We installed four speed humps and purchased a speed calmer. We have begun our recycling program. We have 31 Volunteer organizations in the town with over 600 adult volunteers, who provide a range of services that make the town a great place to live. We have a first class Volunteer Fire Department and currently have six new recruits and a new four-door pumper truck on the way. On behalf of Council. Staff. and the Volunteer Fire Department, I wish all a relaxing Christmas and Holiday season. In the spirit of Christmas, enjoy family and friends and may the New Year be a year of health and happiness!
