
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Biggest Loser Challenge Results



Public Works Reminders to Residents

Snow Clearing Regulations

All residents are reminded that snow clearing regulations are in effect from November 1, 2013 to April 30, 2013. As per Section 3.1 of the Snow Clearing Regulations, vehicles are not to be parked or left on the street (a) between the hours of 12:00 midnight to and including 8:00 a.m.; and (b) at any time when there is a snowfall and for twelve hours after the snowfall has ceased. Residents are also reminded it is not permissible to shovel, plow or blow snow or ice from a driveway or parking lot unto any street (as per Section 3.3 of the Snow Clearing Regulations). Violations of this nature cause safety hazards and inhibit the Town's snow clearing operations. We thank all residents for their cooperation in this regard.



Roaming Animals & Noise Disturbance

The Town has received complaints from residents regarding roaming dogs and excessive dog barking. All residents are asked for their cooperation in keeping their animals safely contained and minimizing noise disturbances. As per Section 4.vi. of the Dog Control Policy and Regulations, "Every owner of a dog shall keep it safely tethered or penned up at all times. A dog need not be tethered or penned up if it is held on a leash by a person capable of restraining the dog's movements." In addition, Section 3.(e) of the Town's Nuisance Regulations states that "No person shall keep or permit to be kept in any building, premises or yard or any part thereof in the Municipality any dog which by reason of barking or howling is a nuisance to persons in the Municipality."



With our ever growing community and its resulting increase in traffic many residents are finding it unsafe to walk, jog, run or bike on our roads. Healthy living is one of our key principles in the community and the walkability of pedestrians on our roads is a high priority. Please visit our website to fill out a quick survey and have your say. This is the first step in engaging the community to help determine a plan of action for the future.





A Call for New Recruits

The PCSP Fire Rescue Department is conducting a Recruitment Drive early in the new year. We operate out of two stations covering both sides of the community. Our Station 1 is located on Portugal Cove Rd while Station 2 is on Thorburn Rd. We respond to a variety of Fire Rescue incidents annually and also provide initial Emergency Medical Assist to Eastern Health when requested. Our current response volume is just under 200 runs. All training, assigned gear, and an annual per diem is provided, come join us and become part of our family.

If you have ever considered becoming a firefighter now is your time to act. As a process of realigning stations we have a need to add more staff, especially in our Station 1 catchment area. A Recruitment package will be available shortly outlining requirements and anyone who wishes more information may leave the Fire Chief a message at 895-8000, ext 257. A planned Open House will be published mid-January for any interested applicants. Residents of the community and living within the boundaries of Portugal Cove-St. Philips we are looking for you. It is an exciting time to become a member, lots of excitement and renewal is just on the horizon.
