### **Expect Delays During the Construction Season**

Construction season is approaching. The Town is continuing to invest in and upgrade our infrastructure. But with construction comes some delays and we wish to advise residents of the affected areas this year:

A new bridge is being constructed on Dogberry Hill Road at Thorburn Road. This will create considerable traffic delays for all residents who normally take this route. Construction will start in the spring and last all summer and into the fall.

A new sanitary sewer main is being installed along Thorburn Road from Dogberry Hill Road to Rainbow Gully Road. It is being installed along side of the road so there will be minimum road work but traffic will still be impacted for the duration of the installation.

The Hardings Hill/Loop Drive Bridge is being replaced which will cause significant traffic delays for the residents. As well Hardings Hill, Loop Drive and North Point Road will be upgraded causing further congestion.

Other localized traffic delays will be experienced as a result of road upgrades on Thorburn Road (from Tucker's Hill to Thorpe's Road), Hanlon's Lane, Rainbow Gully Road, Knight's Rest, and portion of Anglican Cemetery Road.
