Tender Announced for PCSP Middle School



The Provincial Government issued a tender for the construction of a new school for Grades 5-9 in the Town of Portugal Cove-St. Philip's on April 13th. The school will house an anticipated population of approximately 500 students upon opening and is designed to allow for expansion to accommodate 700 students if necessary.

"This tender for construction is a significant step forward in government's work to provide a new school for Portugal Cove-St. Philip's. It will result in safe and modern infrastructure to support the needs of the growing population in the area. Through building and renovating schools, we continue to make sound investments that reflect the priorities of the people of Newfoundland and Labrador."

The new school will be located adjacent to Rainbow Gully Park and will be a two-story building with 31 classrooms. Specialty spaces in the new school will include a gymnasium, commercial kitchen, library/resource centre, home economics room, science labs, technology and fabrication lab suite, two music rooms, art room and a computer room.

"The opportunity for our children to now stay within Portugal Cove – St. Philip's from Kindergarten to Grade 9 will strengthen and enhance our community for years to come. Your Present Town Council convinced the Province and School Board to choose this location, constructed infrastructure services to the site and recommended the School Site be adjacent to Rainbow Gully Park with it in mind. We have been involved since day one to make this dream a reality and we are very pleased with the site and design of this school. With its proximity to the Park it will be like no other school in the Province. We offer a sincere thank you to our MHA Brazil, Min. Transport & Works, the Min., the Dep. Min. and Engineering design staff of the Dept. of Education, and all School Board Personal who made this happen."

Disposing of Household Hazardous Waste

Household hazardous waste (HHW) can be disposed of by bringing them to the Robin Hood Bay Regional Integrated Waste Management Facility located at 340 East White Hills Road. The facility is open on Wednesday's and Saturday's from 8am to 4pm year round. This facility is for residential waste only.

Open Air Fire Regulations

The open air fire regulations protect the community from the nuisance caused by spread the spread of fire set outside. All fires lit or set outside of a building are considered open air fires and are the subject of the regulations. Fireworks displays are considered open air fires. To control these fires, the Town requires a permit to be obtained so that the Fire Chief, or a person designated by the Chief, can determine if conditions are suitable for an open air fire, instruct on proper control measures, get confirmation that controls are in place, and record where the fire is being set. At this time there is no fee for an open air fire permit. The regulations also set authority for a community open air fire ban. When such a ban is in place, no open air fires can be burned. A ban applies even when a permit is obtained.

There are exceptions to the requirement for a permit and also exceptions that will allow specific types of open air fires to be burned during a ban. A permit is not required to burn a fire in fire barrel if the properly constructed and suitable material is burned. A permit is also not required for fires burned in properly manufactured or constructed and operated open air fireplace. Finally permits are not required for barbecues, certified gas burning appliances, or fireworks displays. The conditions for the exemptions and definitions of the appliances are all included in the regulations. Only appliances that meet the definition and are used according to the regulations are exempt. People can still use barbecues and certified gas appliances during a fire ban.

Anyone who sets or lights an open air fire in contravention to the regulations will be ordered to put the fire out. The fire department may also put the fire out. In some cases additional remedies may be taken for contravention of the regulations.

PCSP Emergency Plan Exercise

Members of the Town staff partnered with Fire and Emergency Services NL and the Dept. of Forestry to design, organize and carry out a hybrid table top / functional exercise of the Town's Emergency Plan. The Exercise took place the morning of Tuesday April 14th, and involved a large number of Town staff, members of the Volunteer Fire Department, members of Council and a number of outside organizations such as the Canadian Red Cross, the Royal Newfoundland Constabulary, the Rovers Search and Rescue,



Advanced Education and Skills, Public Safety Canada, St. John Ambulance, Eastern Health, members of the media and more. The scenario, Exercise "Smoked Out", was based on a large scale forest fire involving a multi-station Fire Department response, the declaration of a state of emergency, road closures, and an evacuation. Grade six students from Beachy Cove Elementary enthusiastically played mock evacuees and their Principal, Mr. Aubrey Dawe, also played an integral role in the mock event. The purpose of the exercise is meant as a gap analysis to highlight areas of improvement with the Town's current Emergency Plan and response resources. This type of exercise is hugely beneficial by also providing the opportunity for staff and Council to understand roles and responsibilities and other possible outside resources they would have in the event of a real emergency. The entire event went very well and the Town has received a lot of positive feedback from the province, St. John's Regional Fire Dept., Eastern Health, JTFA and others. Thank you to everyone who played a part in the event, planning and execution, we could not have done it without you.



There is a lot to do in order to see this vision of our community become a reality. Our current roads are heavy with vehicles. Many have narrow, deteriorating shoulders, and often steep ditches. Vehicle speeds and the winding, narrow, rural roads create a hazardous condition, especially where pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles are forced to share the same thoroughfare. Throughout May, SafePCSP is planning a number of campaigns, including a Helmet Fitting & Bike Rodeo with Cychotic Bikes Ltd, to start the transformation towards a culture of caring where everyone takes responsibility for the safety of their neighbours.
