# FireSmart



On July 11th, the Department of Forestry gave a presentation to members of Council and staff on the

FireSmart program. FireSmart is a program of information for communities and home owners with regards to preparation in the threat of wildfires. As our community is particularly blessed with beautiful foliage and many homes tucked into the trees, we are at a much higher risk than most for wildfire. Our Town



has been closely compared to the town of Slave Lake, Alberta, which suffered a devastating wildfire in 2011. One third of the Town of Slave Lake was destroyed and more than 700 residents were left homeless. The FireSmart program can help better prepare residents and emergency personnel in the event of a wildfire. Know your hazards: assess your property and the 30 metre area surrounding it and take action to protect your investment. The plan is easy to follow and the information can be found on the FireSmart website: www.firesmartcanada.ca Good protection can help reduce the risk of damage caused by wildfires, and that includes a good insurance policy too.

# How to Compost

### **Choose Your Bin**

Build a compost bin or buy one from the Town Office – Available now at a cost of \$25 taxes included.

#### Location

Place your outdoor bin in a sunny, easily accessible spot with good drainage.

### **Add Organic Waste**

Alternate between layers of brown and green organic materials. Store your organic kitchen waste in a small, covered container and add it to your bin once or twice a week.

### **Turn the Pile**

Turn and mix your pile after you add new material. Your compost pile should be as moist as a wrung out sponge.

# What Can't Be Composted

- Meat & Fish Products
- Bones
- Fat, Grease, Oils, Sauces
- Dairy Products
- Weeds (that have gone to seed)
- Diseased Plants
- Animal Waste
- Plants treated with Pesticides
- Toxic Chemicals
- Charcoal
- Treated Fire Logs

# What Can Be Composted

Organic waste can be categorized as "brown" or "green" materials. Alternate between balanced layers of each when adding waste to your bin. If your pile is too wet – add brown material; if your pile is too dry – add water and green material.

### BROWN

- Dried Leaves
- Dried & Untreated Grass Clippings
- Non-diseased Plants
- Twigs & Small Branches
- Woodchips & Sawdust from Untreated Wood
- Rice, Oats & Other Grains
- Paper Newspaper, Paper towels, Toilet Paper Rolls, Cereal Boxes
- Dried Corn Stalks
- Pasta (no sauces or oils)
- Peanut Shells
- Bread or Other Baked Goods

### GREEN

- Fruit & Vegetable Peels and Scraps
- Crushed Eggshells
- Coffee Grounds & Filters
- Tea Bags & Leaves
- Fresh Grass Clippings
- Pet Fur
- Dryer Lint
- Vacuum Contents
- Hair from Brushes

### DUCKS AREN'T AS DUCKY AS YOU MIGHT THINK!

Well-meaning people are feeding ducks at various pond sites. While this is a fun activity to do, it may be doing some harm to both the ducks and the water.

### Feeding ducks can:

- lead to concentrations much larger than naturally occur
- can cause ducks to stay longer in the season than they should as they are a migratory bird
- can cause them to become dependant on an unnatural food source
- Ducks can be carriers of a number of unwelcome intestinal bacteria
- As a result of bird seed and breads in the water, dirt and mold to accumulate in the water which can in turn breed more bacteria, etc. which ducks will eat and humans can come in contact with while swimming, etc.

- lead to the spread of diseases among ducks themselves when over concentrated
- lead to higher concentrations of ducks feeding on fish eggs in spawning areas which will in turn deplete trout populations, etc.

Ducks do not need to be fed. They are able to manage to find their own food sources naturally.

Every person getting married in this province must first obtain a marriage licence from the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador. # The Cost of Speeding

Speeding can be a concern on our roads, especially in small towns such as ours. The Royal Newfoundland Constabulary has a structure of speeding fines that we would like to make residents and visitors aware that a driver could face when not adhering to local speed limits:

11-20kms over the limit: Fines start at \$115 Two points per offense.

21-30kms over the limit: Fines start at \$230 Three points per offense

31kms + over the limit: **Fines start at \$345** Four points per offense.



When a driver has a total of 12 points deducted from their license, the license is forfeited and the driver will have to go to a driver's course, as well as see a serious impact on their auto insurance.
