

Residents are reminded that during the period from November 1st 2018 to April 30th 2019, both days inclusive, no person shall park, leave or abandon any vehicle or any portion of any vehicle upon any Street Reservation within the Town between the hours of 12:00 midnight, to and including 8:00 a.m.; and at any time when there is a snowfall and for twelve hours after the snowfall has ceased. Vehicles left on the roadway may be subject to a ticket or be impounded at the owner's expense.

If you own rental property, please ensure your tenants are aware of the parking restrictions.

During snow removal operations and pushback following a weather event, it is very difficult for the Town's operators to effectively clear streets if vehicles are parked on the roadway. This causes them to have to go around the vehicle which then has the potential to leave a lot of snow in the roadway. Help us help you by not parking on the street during weather events.

Residents are also reminded that during this same period, no person shall shovel, plow, blow or cause to be shoveled, plowed or blown any residue snow or ice from a driveway or parking lot unto any Street within the Town.

If you have a private contractor hired for snow removal, please ensure they are aware of the Town's regulations.

Snow Clearing Damage

All Claims for damage must be made in writing to the Town Office no later than May 15th, 2019. Verbal claims will not be responded to. Claims received after this date, will not be considered.

Winter Garbage & Recycling Tips

During the snowy winter months, please keep the following tips in mind:

- Place your bags as close to curbside as possible to ensure our collectors are not walking over icy terrain
- Keep all garbage containers clear of snow and ice
- Do not place your bags on top of snow banks as our operators are not permitted to climb up onto snowbanks to collect bags
- During snow clearing, please ensure your bags or containers are not blocked in by vehicles
- Be mindful that extreme weather affects both our employees and trucks, during those days, your patience is appreciated

HEATING SAFETY – Be Warm and Safe This Winter

There is something about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. But did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

HEATING EQUIPMENT SMARTS:

Install wood burning stoves following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation. All fuel-burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.

Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning. If you smell gas in your gas heater, dodo not light the appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire department or gas company.

FACT! Half of home heating fires are reported during the months of December, January and February.

- Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet from any and all heating equipment
- Never use your oven to heat your home
- Have a qualified professional install space heating equipment, water heaters, etc.
- Have a professional clean your heating equipment and chimney regularly
- Always turn portable heaters off whenever you leave the room
- Always use the fuel specified by the manufacturer
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks.
 Ashes should be completely cooled before putting them in a metal container and keep the container a safe distance from your home
- Test your smoke alarm once a month

Heritage Anchor

This fall, Donna Teasdale, Archaeological Conservator, and her intern Josh Forth were in Portugal Cove-St. Philip's to help the Town's Heritage and Programs Services Coordinator do some conservation work on the anchor that was retrieved from the Portugal Cove Ferry Terminal.

Donna runs the conservation lab for the MUN Archaeology Department and Josh is currently working with Donna on the internship component of his Cultural Heritage Conservation and Management Program through Fleming College. In these pictures, you can see them working to carefully remove the crust that has formed on the anchor to prepare it for the next conservation steps.
