

TRADITIONAL UGLY STICK WORKSHOP

In December, the Town of Portugal Cove - St. Philip's hosted an Ugly Stick Making Workshop in partnership with the St. John's Mummers Festival. More than 30 residents came out to enjoy a night of ugly stick creation, and about 20 of these enjoyable instruments were completed. Everyone had a fantastic time making their very own traditional ugly sticks!

The ugly stick is a percussion instrument traditionally used while mummering in Newfoundland and Labrador. It is made from a long broomstick or branch with a boot on the bottom, beer bottle caps on the sides, and a tin can with a face on top. Many of those



who participated in the workshop brought their new ugly sticks out to the Town's Annual Christmas Parade and played them along with the music of the floats for an afternoon of Christmas fun.

HOME HEATING SAFETY

While the weather outside is chilly and • frightful and the warmth of your space heater can be delightful, they are still one of the leading causes of home fire deaths. Stay warm and safe this winter with some simple safety tips:

- Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet from any and all heating equipment
- Never use your oven to heat your home
- Have a qualified professional install space heating equipment, water heaters, etc.

- Have a professional clean your heating equipment and chimney regularly
- Always turn portable heaters off whenever you leave the room
- Always use the fuel specified by the manufacturer
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks. Ashes should be completely cooled before putting them in a metal container and keep the container a safe distance from your home
- Test your smoke alarm once a month

HALF OF HOME HEATING FIRES ARE REPORTED DURING THE MONTHS OF DECEMBER, JANUARY AND FEBRUARY.

Heating Equipment Smarts:

All fuel-burning equipment must be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning. Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning. If you smell gas in your gas heater, do not light the appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire department.
