Project Title: Water Testing and Caffeine Analysis



**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The Green Team will conduct chemical analysis of various waterways in Portugal Cove-St. Philips and complete river surveys with a main focus on the Beachy Cove Brook system. This project will compare findings from last summer to assess change, as well as new tests for the presence of caffeine in waterways. The Team will act as river survey technicians and complete field work involving collection of water samples, testing and writing a reports based on findings. The Team will profile the chemical and natural historical characteristics of some of the town's waterways. Time permitting, the Team will test for microplastics in town waterways. The Team will also deliver a minimum of five Environmental Awareness Events.

### POSITIONS

**TEAM LEADER (1 Position):** The Team Leader is the day to day supervisor for the Green Team. This person is responsible for the conduct of Team Members and the work they undertake. The Team Leader ensures that the work required is properly assigned and carried out, and that the project proceeds smoothly. This involves planning, maintaining discipline, daily acquisition of project materials, effective communication with the community partner and CCNL staff, administrative duties etc. A team leader should demonstrate the ability to plan and organize, and must have leadership and supervisory skills. **This position is for 8 weeks, at \$12.40/hr for 35 hours per week, from July 2 to August 23, 2019.**

**TEAM MEMBER (3 Positions):** The Team Member is an integral part of the Green Team program. The Team Member follows the direction given by the Team Leader, has the ability to work well in a team environment and feels that s/he can make a positive contribution to the projects undertaken. **These positions are for 8 weeks, at \$11.40/hr for 35 hours per week from July 2 – August 23, 2019.**
