IT'S A TOILET, NOT A TRASH

There are many new bathroom products on the market that are advertised as a better cleaning experience when compared to traditional toilet paper and their labels indicate they are safe for sewers and septic systems. There are also cleaning products that are labeled as flushable which may go down the toilet but they are not breaking down sufficiently enough and are not biodegradable. Flushing such products has led to clogged pipes and jammed pumps in sewer systems. All of these 'flushable' wipes, combined with other items such as extra-thick toilet paper, baby wipes, paper towels, sanitary pads, dental floss, and other items that are not designed to be flushed can all get tangled up in sewer pipes and cause extensive damage to wastewater systems.

Residents are urged to think before they flush and are also urged to educate young children on what can and cannot be flushed. If you are unsure about a product, it is always a safe measure to simply bag it and put it with your garbage.

When in doubt – throw it out.

Never flush the following items – toss them in the trash instead.

Wipes of any type Sanitary products

Medication

Hair

Dental floss

Cotton swabs or balls

Bandages

Rags or paper towels

Latex items

Fat, oil, grease

Clothing labels Candy wrappers

Syringes

Cigarette butts

Disposable toilet brushes

Kitty litter

Aquarium gravel

Plastic

Fruit stickers

The only things that should go down your toilet are pee, poop, and paper.



GREEN TEAM CONTINUES WORK ON WATER ASSESSMENT IN PCSP

Conservation Corps
Newfoundland and
Labrador's Green Team is
back this summer testing the
waterways in Portugal CoveSt. Philip's. In the fourth
consecutive summer of
Green Team efforts, team



members are continuing chemical analyses of the waterways and conducting river surveys in the Beachy Cove Brook system, around Miller's Pond, and more.



The team is testing for excess nitrates and phosphates, information which will build on previous years' data. "This year we are also testing for the presence of caffeine," says team leader Samara Bugden. "Since caffeine shouldn't exist in these systems naturally, if we

discover the presence of caffeine, it can be an indicator of the cause of issues in the waterways." The caffeine testing is being made possible this year through a collaboration with the Marine Institute.





Philip's and is returning for his second year with the Green Team. "It's a fun job," says Roberts, "and I love getting to work outside." Spending two years running with Green Team has familiarized Roberts with the PCSP waterways, and he and his teammates have enjoyed spending their summer trekking through woods and wading

chest-deep into ponds throughout the community.
