CELEBRATING TWO OUTSTANDING WOMEN OF DISTINCTION

Congratulations to PCSP resident, Kimberly Churchill, and Town Staff member, Julie Pomeroy, on their recent nominations for the YWCA 2020 Women of Distinction Awards.

Kimberly is a mother, teacher, advocate, non-profit leader, and mentor to many young girls. She has a rich history of volunteerism, community engagement, and motivational speaking, including delivering a talk at TEDxStJohns 2018 titled, "The Forgotten Language: The Transformative Power of Signing." To help bring about proactive change, Kimberly started a non-profit organization called Children's Language Acquisition Support System Inc. (CLASS) in 2018. Within CLASS, she developed a program called "Gain a Super Power" to introduce American Sign Language (ASL) to hearing children to help bridge the communication gap between them and any deaf schoolmates and to help remove the language barriers that create social isolation of deaf children in schools. This fantastic program runs weekly at our local Beachy Cove Elementary School.

Julie is a community-oriented leader and champion for heritage and environment in NL. Through her volunteerism and her role as Heritage Programs and Services Coordinator for the Town of Portugal Cove-St. Philip's, Julie shares her passion for linking heritage and environment in all she does. Many people in PCSP know Julie through her leading of the Town's Family History Club, the Environment Fair, and through her role as the staff liaison for the Town's Heritage Committee and our Advisory Committee on the Environment (ACE). Julie's passion for community heritage extends from her work life to her volunteerism as well. She has served as chair-person of the Logy Bay-Middle Cove-Outer Cove Museum since 2015 and as Treasurer of the Museum Association of Newfoundland and Labrador from 2017-2019. RECYCLING GUIDELINES: WHAT GOES WHERE ...

PAPER PRODUCTS

Cereal boxes, cracker boxes, shoe boxes, gift boxes, pizza boxes (take-out, delivery, frozen), packing boxes, frozen food boxes, newspapers, magazines, catalogues, glossy mail, flyers, junk mail, computer paper, note paper, envelopes, books, toilet paper rolls, paper towel rolls, egg cartons, coffee trays, paper bags, etc.



Bubble wrap, envelopes, candy wrappers, toilet paper, tissues and napkins, paper towel, wax paper, pet food bags, take out containers, coffee cups, gift bags, wrapping paper, needles and other sharps, clothing, blankets and bedsheets.

CONTAINERS

Aluminum containers (pop and beer cans, disposable baking trays, cookie and cake tins), tin cans (soup cans, coffee cans, tuna cans, pet food cans), milk and juice containers, tetra packs, plastic drink containers (water, pop, liquor bottles) plastic household containers (windshield wash bottles, shampoo, mouthwash, hand soap, contact lens solution), over the counter medicine bottles (vitamins, cough syrup), plastic tubs (butter, sour cream, ice cream), yogurt containers, plastic flower pots, plastic containers marked #s 1-7.



Glass, Styrofoam, aerosol cans, plastic bags, plastic wrap, electronic game cases, full or unopened food containers, paint cans, toys, laundry baskets, pots and pans, seedles or other sharps, car parts, coffee machine cups.

Before you place any items in the recycling, make sure they are rinsed and clean. Thanks!
