Activity	The Cat in the Hat Cup Stack
What you'll need	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Red or White Large Cups and Small Cups• Construction/Cardstock/Computer Paper or Index Cards• <i>The Cat in The Hat</i> Book
Directions	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Prep for this activity by cutting squares of paper appropriate to the size of the cups you will be using. We used two very different size cups, so I cut two different size squares of paper in red and white.2. Set out the stack of cups and the paper squares. Invite your kids to stack the cat's hat!3. How high can you go? Send us a picture of your activity.

What you'll need	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Paper• Red, Blue, White Paint• Markers• Glue• Scissors
Directions	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Paint your fingers blue and your palm white, turn over on paper and press hard2. Paint your whole hand red, turn over and press hard on paper3. Draw face with marker4. Make your own Thing One or Thing Two circle and glue on
