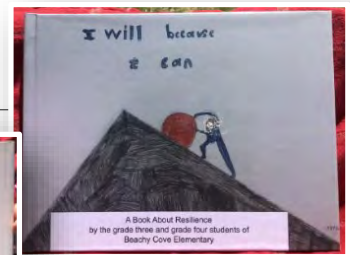

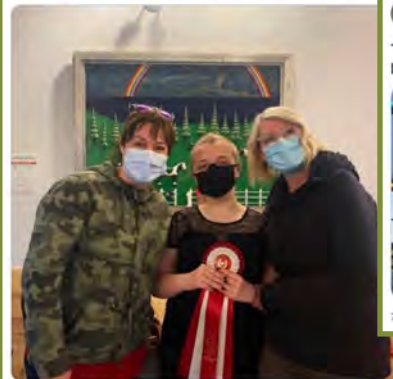

A NEW ADVENTURE FOR ERROL! A NEW BOOK FROM LOCAL AUTHOR AND ILLUSTRATOR

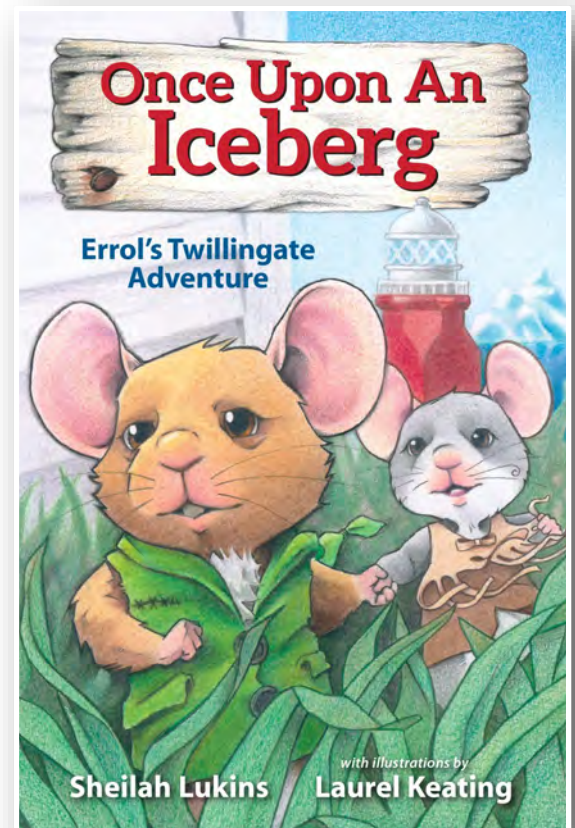

Endangered Species Alert!

On May 27th, 2021, The Provincial Government took action to protect at-risk bat populations by designating and listing two species as endangered under the provincial Endangered Species Act. The Little Brown Myotis (Little Brown Bat) and the Northern Myotis (Long Eared Brown Bat/Keen's Bat) are now considered endangered because of White Nose Disease (WNS).

If there is a need to evict bats a provincial permit is required. Residents of Newfoundland and Labrador are urged to report any sick or dead bats by contacting the Wildlife Division at 709- 637-2025, the toll-free bat hotline at 1-833-434-BATS (2287) or their local forestry and wildlife office.

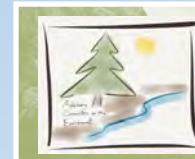
NEW Composting in your community Pilot Project

The Town of Portugal Cove – St. Philip's is taking on a new pilot project to help divert organic waste from our landfill and reduce the release of harmful greenhouse gas emissions. As part of our commitment to the environment and climate action, the Town has set targets to reduce its greenhouse gas emissions from both its municipal operations and from the community as a whole. The Town is committed to a 20% reduction below baseline greenhouse gas emissions for municipal operations and a 6% reduction below baseline emissions for the community by 2030.

Composting provides a highly effective way to reduce emissions usually associated with waste disposal and we as a Town are very excited to take on this new project. We will be installing 4 large Joracan composters in our Town for residents to use. Two of these will be installed in public spaces (Recreation Center and Voisey's Brook Park) and they will be available for all residents to use.

The other Two we are looking for your help and support. To make this a pilot project that turns into something permanent we are going to be trying 4 different scenarios of composting. This will include controlled groups and open groups. The ones in public spaces will be open groups (and controlled by Town staff) and the other 2 will be closed groups and controlled- BY YOU! We are looking for a neighbourhood and a business to come forward to help us be stewards of these compost bins. Each of these compost bins are able to handle the organic waste of up to 30 people. 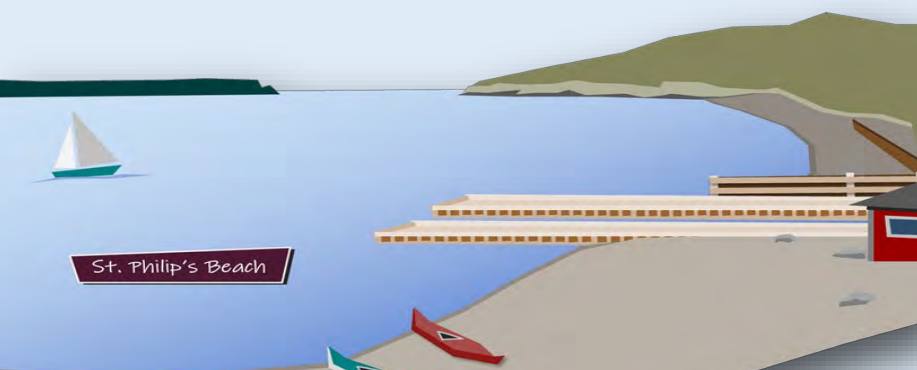
St. Philip's Beach Ad-Hoc Special Committee

Last year emergency repairs were completed to reinforce Spurrells Road after significant coastal erosion threatened the infrastructure in the area. As a result of these emergency repairs, armour stone was utilized to stabilize the bank of the road, resulting in changes to the beach area. Quickly after repairs commenced, concerns were raised by residents regarding the impact that they may have on the beach, a beach that so many of us have enjoyed for so long. As a result, a St. Philip's Beach Ad-Hoc Special Committee was struck by Council. Chaired by Councillor Madonna Stewart-Sharpe the committee is made up from interested members of our community, Council, and staff, to look at ways to reinstate, support, and enhance the area following the emergency repairs.

As recommended by the committee, Council has been completing numerous assessments of the area. In addition the committee has been corresponding with local residents, community groups and environmental professionals on their thoughts and ideas for the future. The committee will be submitting a final report to Council of recommendations in August and we want to hear from you! Please contact Jeff Lawlor, Director, Economic

One idea we have heard we wish to ask the community: Do you see any benefits or drawbacks of making Spurrells Road a one way street? This would allow continued local traffic, however provide more space for the beach and potentially additional parking.

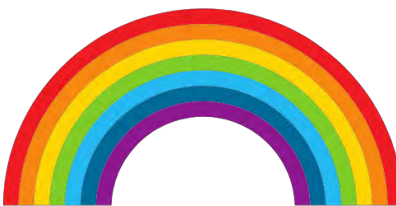

INTRODUCING VOTE BY MAIL

Our election will look very similar this year to the ones you have participated in before. There will be polling stations throughout the community and you will be able to vote in person on September 28th or at an advanced poll. However, in order to mitigate any potential issues regarding COVID-19 the Town will be introducing a Vote by Mail option this year. Any resident will be able to request that a Vote by Mail Kit be sent to them in the weeks leading up to the election. Residents can choose to mail back in their ballot prior to Election Day, they may also drop it off at the Town Hall the week prior to September 28th or bring it to their assigned Polling Station the day of the election.

Details on how and when to register for the Vote by Mail kit will be announced soon.
