Stable Life

Stable Life Inc. - Spirit Horse Program announced late September that it temporarily had to pause its free mental health services. The non-profit organization offering free equine-assisted mental health programs hopes to resume programs as soon as more sustainable funding is found. Other projects, such as their children's programming and special events, will continue as normal as they seek further partnerships.

Stable Life has been an integral part of the community since 2015. They participate in numerous town events including the Christmas Parade, Fall Family Festival, and provide mental health services for people in our Town as well as recreation



programs. They were recently awarded \$1500 from the David Suzuki program to be part of the National Healing Forests Initiative to promote reconciliation, healing, and community throughout Canada.

This year they held their first horse show and it was a huge success. Over 30 horses and riders attended the event which was in honour of the 10th anniversary of the Spirit Horse program which is in memory of Alison Walsh. YOUNG INNOVATOR Represents Canada at MILSET ESI 2023

Makenzie Wishart, a ninth-grade student and a long-time resident of Portugal Cove-St. Philip's was granted a remarkable opportunity to represent Canada at the MILSET Expo-Sciences International 2023, scheduled to take place in Puebla, Mexico from October 21 to 27.

MILSET Expo-Sciences International is a prestigious platform where young innovators from across the world showcase their STEM projects. This event facilitates a cross-cultural exchange of ideas and innovations, offering participants the chance to engage with exhibits from STEM-related institutions. With representation from over 30 countries, this event serves as an extraordinary gathering of young minds dedicated to advancing the frontiers of knowledge and creativity. WINTER PARKING BAN

2023 WASTE COLLECTION

Residents are reminded that during the period from **November 1**st **to April 30**th, both days inclusive, no person shall park, leave, or abandon any vehicle or any portion of any vehicle upon any Street Reservation within the Town **between the hours of 12:00 midnight to and including 8:00am;** and at any time when there is a snowfall and for **12 HOURS** after the snowfall has ceased. **Vehicles left on the roadway may be subject to a ticket or be impounded at the owner's expense.**

THE IMPORTANCE OF ROADSIDE DITCHES

Roadside ditches play a very important role in maintaining environmental health by effectively removing nitrogen and other pollutants from runoff. The accumulation of nitrogen in the environment has led to harmful algal blooms

and dead zones in coastal waters, posing serious threats to aquatic ecosystems and human health. Roadside ditches, especially those in regions with higher human activity, are proficient at nitrogen removal, akin to natural ecosystems like wetlands and rivers. Proper management of these ditches is crucial to enhance their effectiveness in nutrient removal and to mitigate the



WHY WE NEED TO TREAT ROADSIDE DITCHES AS WATERWAYS

One of the primary reasons for treating roadside ditches as waterways is to protect water quality. These ditches often collect runoff containing various pollutants like oil, chemicals, and debris from roads. Treating them as waterways entails applying similar water quality protection measures as traditional streams and rivers, ensuring that these pollutants are prevented from entering larger water bodies. By safeguarding water quality, we can maintain the ecological balance and protect aquatic life.

These ditches serve an essential function in **flood control**. By managing stormwater runoff efficiently, roadside ditches can prevent flooding on roads and surrounding areas. Proper design and maintenance are critical in ensuring adequate water flow and capacity, reducing the risk of road damage, and preventing property loss due to flooding.

Erosion control is another significant benefit of treating roadside ditches as waterways. Like natural water bodies, roadside ditches can erode over time, leading to excessive sedimentation in downstream water bodies. Implementing erosion control measures helps maintain the stability of these ditches, preserving aquatic habitats and protecting water quality.

WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF WE DIDN'T MAINTAIN CLEAN ROADSIDE DITCHES

Neglecting roadside ditches and treating them as garbage disposal areas can have serious consequences. Dumping waste and pollutants into these ditches leads to **water pollution** as the contaminants are washed into larger water bodies during rain events. This **harms aquatic life** and **negatively impacts water quality**, affecting both human and ecosystem health. Furthermore, littering and garbage accumulation in roadside ditches **degrade habitats for plants and animals**. The disruption of the local ecosystem can lead to **loss of vegetation**, exacerbating the environmental issues caused by pollution. Improperly managed roadside ditches can also result in **drainage issues** and **increased flooding** during heavy rain events. Garbage blocking the flow of water can hinder the ability of ditches to handle stormwater runoff efficiently, causing flooding in surrounding areas and damaging roads and properties. The presence of garbage in roadside ditches also poses **public health risks**. It attracts pests, such as rats and mosquitoes, which can spread diseases and threaten the well-being of nearby residents. The burden of cleaning up garbage-filled roadside ditches falls on taxpayers or local governments. Frequent cleanup efforts are not only costly but also divert resources that could be be better used for other environmental initiatives.



Image 1.0 demonstrates an unhealthy roadside ditch. Littered with garbage from people, no visible water flow, this makes for not only unappealing aesthetics, but an unhealthy waterway.



Image 1.2 demonstrates a well managed and maintained roadside ditch. Clean flowing water and healthy riparian vegetation shows that this is a well functioning waterway.

ap Storms

Winter storms can happen almost anywhere. They can cause us problems. Know what to do before, during and after a storm. This will help keep you and your family safe from a winter fire.

- Test all smoke alarms. Do this at least once a month. This way you will know they are working. Install carbon monoxide alarms in your home. Test the alarms.
- . Plan two ways out of the home in case of an emergency. Clear driveway and front walk of ice and snow. This will provide easy access to your home.
- Make sure your house number can be seen from the street. If you need help, firefighters will be able to find you.
- . Be ready in case the power goes out. Have flashlights on hand. Also have battery-powered lighting and fresh batteries. Never use candles.
- Stay aware of winter weather. Listen to the television or radio for updates. Watch for bulletins online.
- Check on neighbors. Check on others who may need help.
- Generators should be used outdoors. Keep them away from windows and doors. Do not run a generator inside your garage, even if the door is open.
- Stay away from downed wires. Report any downed wires to authorities.
- Be ready if the heat stops working. Use extra layers of clothes and blankets to stay warm. If you use an emergency heat source, keep anything that can burn at least 1 metre away.
- Turn portable heaters off when you leave the room. Turn them off when you go to bed.
