PCSP HAS A NEW HOUSING CO-OPERATIVE!



- Killick Ecovillage Co-operative is the first housing co-op in the province in 30+ years, according to the Newfoundland-Labrador Federation of Co-operatives.
- Killick Ecovillage is a 30-home mixed-income, intergenerational cohousing community situated on 58 acres of heritage farmland in Portugal Cove-St. Philip's, estimated for occupancy for 2025/2026.
- The project was instigated by future residents and has been designed by and for the people who will live there, who are co-investors during project development and will self-manage the community and permaculture farm when complete.
- Killick Ecovillage aims to create a sustainable, resilient community that fosters a deeper connection with nature while promoting social harmony and environmental stewardship. Through innovative design, permaculture principles, and community engagement, we're building a model for sustainable living that inspires and empowers individuals to lead fulfilling, eco-conscious lives.

KILLICK COAST FOOD HUB → starting in July the Food Hub will be using the old schoolhouse as its new place of operations.

MINI → Newfoundland salt box house now sits on the spot that the Virgin Mary statue was. It is a beacon of welcome with its vibrant traditional yellow colour, and at night it is lit from solar power gained during the day.

OLD SCHOOLHOUSE → renovations are currently underway, and we look forward to using this space for many positive projects and a rental space for the community. This summer we plan to have benches and tables where people can enjoy a picnic.

LAND → 10 acres of the AWH land still has some of the old property lines, marked by piled rocks, as well as trails that our forebears built as they carved out a living there. 

ATV & Off-Road Vehicle Safety

Adventure awaits, but safety comes first! Whether you're exploring trails on an ATV or exploring off-road terrain, we kindly remind residents of the following:

Safety first! Always wear your helmet, goggles, gloves, and protective clothing. It's not just about looking cool – it's about staying safe.

Know Your Ride: Get to know your ATV or off-road vehicle inside and out before hitting the gas. Understanding its capabilities and limitations are key to a safe ride.



Ride Responsibly: Follow speed limited on designated ATV trails, and rules of the off-road vehicles act. Be courteous to other riders, hikers, and wildlife you encounter along the way.

Stay Sober: Never operate your ATV or off-road vehicle under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Your safety and the safety of others depend on clear judgment.

All drivers are reminded to use extra caution when behind the wheel! Here are some tips to help keep everyone safe:

- Drivers are required to stop when any school bus has it's red stop signs flashing and wait until the **stop sign** has closed.
- Parents and passengers, please wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and for its stop sign to be flashing before moving to board the bus.
- When **yellow lights** are flashing, prepare to stop.
- A "School Zone" means the portion or length of highway between the two posted signs indicating a school zone. In PCSP, the posted speed limit in school zones are 30 km/hr.
- · Drivers travelling in both directions, in all traffic lanes (this means single, double, triple lanes on either side) must come to a complete stop when the school bus has its red lights flashing and stop sign out.

You can report unsafe driving around school busses with the RNCs online reporting tool!



Sitting under the stars by a crackling fire has its appeal. It's where stories are told, sing-a-longs happen, and meals are cooked over an open flame. Campfires bring family and friends together. But campfire mishaps can cause injuries. With a few safety tips, you can prevent these accidents.

SAFETY AROUND THE FIRE

- Before setting up a campfire, be sure it is permitted. Check with your local fire department.
- If campfires are permitted, they need to be at least 25 feet away from any structure and anything that
- Clear away dry leaves and sticks, overhanging low branches and shrubs.
- Avoid burning on windy, dry days. It is easier for open burning to spread out of control when it is windy and dry.
- Watch children while the fire is burning. Never let children or pets play or stand too close to the fire.
- Attend to the campfire at all times. A campfire left alone for only a few minutes can grow into a damaging fire.
- Keep a campfire small which is easier to control.
- Never use gasoline or other flammable or combustible liquids.
- Always have a hose, bucket of water, or shovel and dirt or sand nearby to put out the fire. Make sure to put it completely out before leaving the site.
- If your clothes catch fire, stop, drop, and roll. Stop, drop to the ground and cover your face with your hands. Roll over and over or back and forth until the fire is out.
- Treat a burn right away. Cool the burn with cool water for 3 to 5 minutes. Cover with a clean, dry cloth. Get medical help if needed.



Roast with Care

If roasting marshmallows, help young children. Never shake a roasting marshmallow. It can turn into a flying, flaming ball. A heated metal skewer can cause burns.



Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) Application

For residents who are looking to avail of the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) discount, we would like to remind those interested in applying of the following qualifications:

- Form SC-ISP-3057 is required annually from Service Canada which validates that you are in receipt of the Guaranteed Income Supplement for a twelve-month period. If you have not received your form or have misplaced it, please call Service Canada at 1-800-277-9914 to request this entitlement letter before submitting your application.
- 2. An application for the Guaranteed Income Supplement discount is required annually. The application is available at the Town Office or on the Town's website at pcsp.ca / services / documents & applications.
- The address on your Service Canada letter MUST match the civic address of your principal residence.
- You must be the assessed owner (or joint owner) of the property and occupy the property as your principal residence year-round.
- The property owner must complete and sign their own application unless you have an appointed Power of Attorney; in this case, the POA documents must accompany your application.
