## **PCSP Lions Club Elect New District Governor**

The Portugal Cove - St. Philip's Lions Club is happy to announce that Lion Bradley Moss, a 21-year member, was elected and assumed the role of District Governor for Eastern Newfoundland on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024. The first PCSP Lion to ever be elected Governor, Moss will be responsible for 49 Clubs with over 1,100 members for a one-year term. His theme, "Seeing Eye to Eye", is reflective of the Lions Clubs commitment to sight conservation and continuing work with the blind. In 2014, he co-founded the Lions / Team Broken Earth partnership and has led 12 eye missions to Haiti, Nicaragua and Guatemala providing Canadian quality eye exams and distributing over 15,000 pieces of eyewear to people in need.





This was a concept that I have been thinking about for a couple years after having my own positive experiences playing in similar leagues around the metro area. I wanted to create a similar league locally, with a focus on inclusion and being active.

I officially partnered with the Spurrs to bring the league to life - Past President, Patricia, was a great support and wealth of knowledge where we met and chatted for many months to firm up a plan. Because of this partnership, we were able to register players through the Spurrs club and get registered with NLSA to make the league official.

Registration was overwhelming, we had to close it quickly and start a waitlist because of interest! The league consisted of 60 players divided into 4 teams. Played 1 hour, half field games every Friday night for 7 weeks with playoffs at the end, with a total of 16 games played.



Every skill level was welcomed and teams were balanced with a range from inexperienced to women who played at a University/Jubilee level. Opening night we had Gill Whelan of Whelan Wellness give a quick welcome/pep talk and invited the Spurrs Technical director Matt DaSilva to teach proper warm up techniques. The league hired Makenzie Howell and Katie Slade from the Spurrs U15 PYL Champions league team to referee all our games.

Friendships were made, skills were developed, while we supported and encouraged each other week after week. We always had fans watching! We had spouses, friends, family members, and our own children in the stands or playing on the sidelines. Even local kids out on their bikes would stop and watch and cheer us on! Most importantly, because of the success of this league, we will be able to grow it, offering the league again in the Fall, and hopefully again season after season, expanding and getting better every time!

## HELP KEEP OUR COMMUNITY SAFE WITH SCHOOL BUS SAFETY TIPS

As winter weather conditions are upon us once again, all drivers are reminded to use extra caution when behind the wheel. Here are some tips to help keep everyone safe:

- 1. Drivers are required to stop when any school bus has its red stop signs flashing and wait until the stop sign has closed.
- 2. Parents and passengers, please wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and for its stop sign to be flashing before moving to board the bus.
- 3. When yellow lights are flashing prepare to stop.
- **4.** A "School Zone" means the portion or length of highway between the two posted signs indicating a school zone, in PCSP the posted speed limit in School Zones are 30 km/hr.
- 5. Drivers travelling in both directions in all traffic lanes (this means single, double, triple lanes on either side) must come to a complete stop when the school bus has its red lights flashing and stop sign out.



**DID YOU KNOW?** You can be fined between \$500 - \$1,200 for illegally passing a school bus and speeding in a school zone can lead to vehicle impoundment and fines from \$400 - \$1,800 and up to six demerit points (Source: gov.nl.ca)

**DID YOU KNOW?** There are over 1000 students who attend daily classes in PCSP and use the school bus to get to their classes safely.

**DID YOU KNOW?** Every school bus has danger zones! The danger zone is the 10 foot area around the bus in every direction. The most dangerous areas of the bus are the front of the bus and the right rear tire area.

**DID YOU KNOW?** You can report unsafe driving around school busses with the RNC's online reporting tool.


## **PCSP SPURRS**

## HOLIDAY Waste Collection Schedule

- Monday, December 23<sup>rd</sup> to Tuesday, December 31<sup>st</sup>, residents are asked to have garbage and recycling placed outside **before** 7:00am due to shortened collection hours.

## Winter Parking Ban

With winter weather on the way, we would like to remind residents and motoring traffic of the winter parking ban. During the period from **November 1st to April 30th**, both days inclusive, no person shall park, leave, or abandon any vehicle or any portion of any vehicle upon any Street Reservation within the Town **between the hours of 12:00 midnight to and including 8:00am; and at any time when there is a snowfall and for 12 HOURS after the snowfall has ceased.** Vehicles left on the roadway may be subject to a ticket or be impounded at the owner's expense.



## **FALL** Reminders

As the fall season is in full swing, we would like to remind remind residents of a few key seasonal tasks to keep our town safe and running smoothly.

#### **Leaf Collection**

Fallen leaves can clog drains and cause flooding. Please remember to rake leaves from your property and avoid placing them in ditches or drains. Bagged leaves can be left for curbside collection on designated days.

#### Waste Collection

As temperatures drop, avoid storing garbage outside for extended periods to prevent animals from getting into waste. Please adhere to the weekly collection schedule for proper disposal.

#### **Winter Prep**

With winter around the corner, now is the perfect time to check your home's drainage systems and ensure gutters are clear. Prepare for snow by marking the edges of your driveways for easier plowing and snow clearing.

## Smoke Alarms: Make Them Work for You

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area (like a hallway), and on each level (including the basement) of the home.
- When installing, follow the instructions that come with the smoke alarm.
- For the best protection, interconnect all smoke alarms. When one sounds, they all sound. It is important to have interconnected smoke alarms if you sleep with the bedroom doors closed.
- A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month and replace the batteries every six (6) months.
- Make sure smoke alarms meet the needs of all family members including those with sensory and physical disabilities.

## MAYOR'S Message




