Did you know?

As winter settles in, it's important to ensure your garbage and recycling can be safely collected despite snow and ice.

Winter Parking Ban

With winter weather on the way, we would like to remind residents and motoring traffic of the winter parking ban. During the period from November 1st to April 30th, both days inclusive, no person shall park, leave, or abandon any vehicle or any portion of any vehicle upon any Street Reservation within the Town between the hours of 12:00 midnight to and including 8:00am; and at any time when there is a snowfall and for 12 HOURS after the snowfall has ceased. Vehicles left on the roadway may be subject to a ticket or be impounded at the owner's expense.

Introducing the

TOWNS AND LOCAL SERVICE DISTRICTS ACT



Residents of Portugal Cove-St. Philip's will benefit from significant changes to municipal governance with the introduction of the Towns and Local Service Districts Act (TLSDA), which comes into effect on January 1, 2025. This modern and enabling legislation replaces the Municipalities Act, 1999 and is designed to help towns and local service districts better meet the needs and expectations of their communities.

The TLSDA provides municipalities with increased autonomy and flexibility, empowering towns to address local issues and opportunities more effectively. By reducing the need for ministerial oversight and cutting red tape, the Act ensures that decision-making processes are streamlined, allowing towns to focus on what matters most-building strong, sustainable communities.

A key feature of the TLSDA is its emphasis on transparency and accountability. All council meetings, including committee meetings, will now be open to the public, except in cases where legitimate reasons require a closed session. This change fosters greater public oversight, encouraging residents to engage with and understand the decisions that shape their community.

The Act modernizes language, using gender-neutral terminology, and eliminates outdated requirements, such as mandatory newspaper advertising for public notices. Instead, towns can now use modern technology to communicate effectively with residents, ensuring timely access to important information.

Ultimately, the TLSDA supports the creation of safer, more sustainable, and economically vibrant communities. By prioritizing good governance, transparency, and innovation, it ensures that municipalities like ours can meet the evolving needs of residents today and in the future.

Get Alerts as they Happen with PCSP Connects!

Did you know that the Town of PCSP has a resident alert system, PCSP Connects? When you sign up, you can create custom alerts and be notified about changes in waste collection, service interruptions, emergency information, events happening in the community, and more! Sign up via our website, pcsp.ca and look for 'PCSP Connects' on the top right of the purple banner – follow the prompts, and choose to receive alerts via text message, email or through landline phone calls. Choosing to receive landline calls? The number will appear with an Alberta area code with an automated voice relaying the message – don't worry, it's us! If you wish to unsubscribe, listen to the full message and at the end you will be given prompts to unsubscribe.

HELP KEEP OUR COMMUNITY SAFE WITH **SCHOOL BUS SAFETY TIPS**

As winter weather conditions are upon us once again, all drivers are reminded to use extra caution when behind the wheel. Here are some tips to help keep everyone safe:

- 1. Drivers are required to stop when any school bus has its red stop signs flashing and wait until the stop sign has closed.
- 2. Parents and passengers, please wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and for its stop sign to be flashing before moving to board the bus.
- 3. When yellow lights are flashing prepare to stop.
- 4. A "School Zone" means the portion or length of highway between the two posted signs indicating a school zone, in PCSP the posted speed limit in School Zones are 30 km/hr.
- 5. Drivers travelling in both directions in all traffic lanes (this means single, double, triple lanes on either side) must come to a complete stop when the school bus has its red lights flashing and stop sign out.



DID YOU KNOW? You can be fined between \$500 - \$1,200 for illegally passing a school bus and speeding in a school zone can lead to vehicle impoundment and fines from \$400 - \$1,800 and up to six demerit points (Source: gov.nl.ca)

DID YOU KNOW? There are over 1000 students who attend daily classes in PCSP and use the school bus to get to their classes safely.

DID YOU KNOW? Every school bus has danger zones! The danger zone is the 10 foot area around the bus in every direction. The most dangerous areas of the bus are the front of the bus and the right rear tire area.

DID YOU KNOW? You can report unsafe driving around school busses with the RNC's online reporting tool.





Know what to do before, during and after a storm. This will help keep you and your family safe from a winter fire.

- Test all smoke alarms. Do this at least once a month. This way you will know they are working. Install carbon monoxide alarms in your home. Test the alarms.
- Plan two ways out of the home in case of an emergency. Clear driveway and front walk of ice and snow. This will provide easy access to your home.
- Make sure your house number can be seen from the street. If you need help, firefighters will be able to find you.
- Be ready in case the power goes out. Have flashlights on hand. Also have battery-powered lighting and fresh batteries. Never use candles.
- Stay aware of winter weather. Listen to the television or radio for updates. Watch for bulletins online.
- Check on neighbors. Check on others who may need help.
- Generators should be used outdoors. Keep them away from windows and doors. Do not run a generator inside your garage, even if the door is open.
- Stay away from downed wires. Report any downed wires to authorities.
- Be ready if the heat stops working. Use extra layers of clothes and blankets to stay warm. If you use an emergency heat source, keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet away.
- Turn portable heaters off when you leave the room. Turn them off when you go to bed.

IMPORTANT

There are more home fires in winter than in any other season. Half of all home heating fires happen in December, January and February.

As you stay cozy and warm this winter season, be fire smart!



ANNUAL TAX TIME

Tax invoices are available the first week of January 2025.

If Canada's postal services have resumed, the invoices will be mailed during the first week of January. If you have not received your tax bill, please contact ar@pcsp.ca.

- Property owner(s) are responsible for ensuring the Town has their current mailing address on file.
- Property owner(s) are responsible for understanding their tax and interest obligations regardless of any error in the issuance of notification from the Town.
- Payment deadline is March 31, 2025.
- Taxes not paid in full by the due date, are subject to a one percent (1%) compounded interest rate which will be applied on the first day of every month.
- Accounts with a balance forward in January for the prior years' taxes, may be subject to collection measures, recovery and legal action.
- Accounts currently on a pre-authorized payment plan will automatically be re-calculated based on your current balance.
