What are the key changes to town meetings?



- All Committee Meetings are now open to the public for observation.
- Residents can sit in the public gallery to observe discussions but are not permitted to speak.
- Meetings will follow a three-week schedule, including both Council and Committee meetings.



Why were these changes made?

- The changes comply with the new Towns and Local Service Districts Act, which came into effect province wide on January 1, 2025.
- This legislation aims to enhance transparency and public trust in municipal decision
 -making

What are Quarterly Town Halls, and why are they replacing Q&A sessions?

- Quarterly Town Halls provide structured opportunities for public engagement.
- They allow Council to prepare detailed and accurate answers to residents' questions.
