> The rain will wash away the clay, the soil will help the seeds sprout, and the bees will thank you!



YOUR KIT CONTAINS:

air dry clay

soil

seeds

You will also need something to cover your workspace to help with clean up. You can use recycling material like newspaper or flyers.

LET'S GET STARTED:

gather your supplies together




2 cover your workspace, maybe your kitchen table or cover a baking sheet





use your thumb and make an indent in the ball of clay



5 poke a pinch of soil in the indent followed by a pinch of seeds
