### Bridging the Gap THE NEW HORIZONS PROJECT

Portugal Cove-St. Philip's and Brookside Intermediate buzzed with quiet excitement as the New Horizons Project kicked off. This initiative wasn't just another set of programs-it was a bridge, a chance for seniors and youth to connect, share, and learn from each other. It started with Family History Club, a group of local historians who volunteer their time to trace the history of families in PCSP. They presented as students listened intently learning about lineage back five generations. Meanwhile, across the hall, knitting needles clicked rhythmically as senior volunteers guided eager young hands. "Slip the stitch like this," they said patiently, helping the youth loop their yarn into a neat pattern. What started as a simple dishcloth became a symbol of patience and tradition passed down through generations. "Every stitch tells a story," they were told.

But perhaps the most heartwarming part of the project was the Letter Link Program - a pen pal project. Letters traveled back and forth between seniors and fifth-grade students, sharing memories, jokes, and dreams. When the day finally came for the two groups to meet in person, the school was filled with laughter and warm embraces.

As the project wrapped up, the bonds formed remained unbreakable. The New Horizons Project had done more than teach skills-it had built relationships, reminding everyone that the past and future were always connected, hand in hand, The Town was successful in received funding for this project through Government of Canada.

# Garbage Box CLEAN-UP

As the winter chill fades away and the warmth of spring and summer returns, it's time to give some TLC to waste collection boxes! Regular cleaning helps keep unwanted smells at bay, and free of rodents and pests ensuring a fresher environment for your home. According to Waste Management Canada, nearly 40% of household waste is comprised of organic materials, making waste collection boxes prime breeding grounds for bacteria and pests.

-Tips-for-Effective-Gleaning

- Inspect boxes and bins for sharp items, and remove carefully using gloves.
- Use a mixture of mild detergent and water to scrub the inside and outside of your bins thoroughly.
- Rinse bins with a hose to remove any remaining residue.
- Consider adding baking soda or vinegar to your cleaning solution for extra odor-fighting power.

# Do you Have your Open Air Burn Permit?

#### Forest Fire Season is from May 1st to September 30th

During Forest Fire season, from May 1 to September 30, residents must obtain (1) the provincial department of Fisheries, Forestry and Agriculture Permit to Burn, prior to applying for (2) a PCSP permit. The forestry permit number can be entered on the town application.

Residents are reminded that a town permit is required at any time during the year for open air burning. The application for an open air permit is available online here.

The Portugal Cove St. Philip's Volunteer Fire Department wishes to advise residents that Permits for Open Air Fires, for the purposes of burning brush and other non-prohibited materials are required throughout the entire year. Should a resident require telephone support to obtain a permit, please call the Town Hall at 895-8000 ext. 267.

Note: Permits are issued only for the burning of natural brush and grass etc. It is not permissible to utilize such a fire to dispose of garbage, building materials or other debris. Residents are also reminded that a Permit to Burn is required from the Department of Fisheries, forestry and Agriculture, during the provincial Forest Fire season, which runs from May 1 to September 30, 2025.

This permit is available by contacting the Paddy's Pond forestry station at 709-729-4180. The forestry permit is required in conjunction with a permit from the Portugal Cove St. Philip's Volunteer Fire Department.

During Forest Fire season residents must obtain the Fisheries and Land Resources Permit prior to applying for a PCSP permit. The forestry permit number can be entered on the town application.

We encourage residents to assess the forest fire risk via the <u>Fire Hazard Index</u>.

Also, be courteous of neighbors while burning and familiarize yourselves with the Town's Open-Air Fire Regulations

A permit is not required for use of outdoor fire pits, wood burning ovens, chimeneas or fire barrels nor are permits required. However, please follow our <u>Backyard Fireplace Safety</u> <u>Tips.</u>
