Public Notice of Types of Acceptable Identification

If your name is not on the municipality's voter list, you have <u>four</u> options to prove your identity and address:

1) Confirmation of your identity by an Election Official

 An election official can confirm your identity. An election official can confirm the identities of as many people as necessary.

OR

2) Show one piece of Government issued photo ID that shows both your name and current address, such as:

- your driver's license
- any other government issued ID with your photo, name and current address

OR

3) Show two pieces of ID which, together, confirm your name and current address.

At least <u>one</u> piece of identification must have your <u>current address</u>. You may bring a printed copy or show the election official on a mobile device. For example:

- health card
- Canadian passport
- birth certificate
- certificate of Canadian citizenship
- · citizenship card
- social insurance number card
- old age security card
- · hospital card
- label on a prescription container
- identity bracelet issued by a hospital or long-term care facility
- blood donor card
- student identity card
- · public transportation card
- library card
- utility bill (e.g. electricity; telecommunications services including telephone, cable or satellite)

- bank statement
- personal cheque
- government cheque/cheque stub or pension plan statement
- · residential lease or sub-lease
- · mortgage contract or statement
- · income tax assessment
- property tax assessment or evaluation
- vehicle ownership, insurance certificate, policy or statement
- letter of confirmation of residence, letter of stay, admission form or statement of benefits from one of the following designated establishments:
 - o student residence
 - o seniors' residence
 - o long-term care facility

OR

4) If you cannot present ID that shows your name and address, you must take an oath or affirmation (MEF-13)

Important information about ID:

- Your name and current address must be printed (not handwritten) on the ID.
- An expired ID is acceptable, provided it includes your name and current address. The list above
 is not an exhaustive list. If you have questions about the types of acceptable identification for
