The Canadian Veteran Freedom Riders (CVFR) are a national motorcycle riding club founded in 2010 by a retired Canadian Armed Forces member, to provide a supportive community for Veteran and Veteran Supporters though shared interest in motorcycling and military camaraderie. The club organizes charity events and fundraisers for Veterans, serving retired military members and other charitable causes. The local chapter of CVFR Avalon, consists of 22 members made up of retired Veterans, Veteran supporters and first responders; several of which are from our community.

CVFR Avalon unit values the contributions made by our youth and the role that learning our military history and current military events plays in shaping future leaders and exceptional people. As a result, an annual scholarship valued at \$1000 was established. This merit-based scholarship is open annually to any grade 12 graduating high school student in the Newfoundland and Labrador English School District, who exhibits exemplary leadership, self-improvement, and volunteerism. Applicants are required to complete an essay of not less than 1500 words on one of the following topics: A defining battle or military accomplishment for Newfoundlanders; Contribution of women during times of war and armed conflict; or Contribution of Indigenous people in the Canadian military.

This year's recipient is Natalie Mitchell of Portugal Cove-St. Philip's. Natalie is a graduate of Holy Heart of Mary High School and is enrolled in the Bachelor of Engineering program at Memorial University. CVFR Avalon president, Dennis Woodland, presented Natalie with her scholarship cheque at the Town's local War Memorial on Loop Drive.

#### **Winter Parking Ban**

With winter weather on the way, we would like to remind residents and motoring traffic of the winter parking ban. During the period from **November 1**st **to April 30**th, both days inclusive, no person shall park, leave, or abandon any vehicle or any portion of any vehicle upon any Street Reservation within the Town **between the hours of 12:00 midnight to and including 8:00am; and at any time when there is a snowfall and for 12 HOURS after the snowfall has ceased.** Vehicles left on the roadway may be subject to a ticket or be impounded at the owner's expense.

As the fall season is in full swing, we would like to remind remind residents of a few key seasonal tasks to keep our town safe and running smoothly.

#### **Leaf Collection**

Fallen leaves can clog drains and cause flooding. Please remember to rake leaves from your property and avoid placing them in ditches or drains. Bagged leaves can be left for curbside collection on designated days.

#### **Waste Collection**

As temperatures drop, avoid storing garbage outside for extended periods to prevent animals from getting into waste. Please adhere to the weekly collection schedule for proper disposal.

#### Winter Prep

With winter around the corner, now is the perfect time to check your home's drainage systems and ensure gutters are clear. Prepare for snow by marking the edges of your driveways for easier plowing and snow clearing.

# On August 9th, 2025 we officially received a call for assistance from the provincial government asking for help with the Kingston fire.

The chiefs office immediately began working to gather crews and equipment to send, keeping in mind the needs for our own community. 2300hrs on Aug. 9 a fully staffed crew was on their way to Kingston. This continued for some time and officially ended Aug. 22. Not to forget that during a stand down mission from Kingston for a couple days as conditions were unsafe, they were called into service for the Paddy's Pond fire.

Over those 14 days our members committed over 1200 hours of service not including the 18 emergency calls we received in PCSP during that time frame.

To put these numbers in perspective last year our members completed 2700 hours of training in 365 days

Thank you to the many, many volunteers who stepped up from other communities to help during this time. And thank you for the support over social media, for the many messages, and cards we recieved.
