Portugal Cove–St. Philip's is proud to celebrate Olivia Acreman, who has been representing our community on the national soccer stage. Olivia competed at the 2025 Toyota National Soccer Championship in Charlottetown, PEI, as a member of the U15 PYL St. John's Soccer Club. As the only PCSP player on the team, she helped secure their place at Nationals after winning the provincial league title. The team delivered a strong performance, finishing with a 2–2 record against top competition from across the country.

More recently, Olivia returned from Laval, Quebec, where she competed in the U16 NDC Cup hosted by Canada Soccer. She was selected to play with Canada Selects, a team made up of elite players from across the country, competing against teams from Ontario and Quebec.

The Town congratulates Olivia on these outstanding achievements and wishes her continued success as she proudly represents PCSP and Newfoundland and Labrador.



Keep Your Garbage Box Accessible

Clear away snow and ice from around your garbage box to allow for easy collection.

Mark Your Garbage Box Clearly

Use reflective markers or flags to make your garbage box visible in snowy conditions, especially during low-light mornings.

Place Items Safely on the Curb

If you don't have a garbage box, place bags and bins securely curb side, avoiding where they might be buried by snow plows.

Winter Parking Ban

Until April 30th, 2026 (Inclusive)



No parking on any street reservation within the Town between the hours of 12:00am (midnight) to and including 8:00am.



At any time when there is a snowfall and for 12 hours after the snowfall has ceased.



Vehicles left on the roadway may be ticketed or towed at the owner's expense.

2026 Schedule of Meetings



When the weather turns cold, it can bring a chill into our homes. Portable space heaters have become a popular way to supplement central heating or heat one room. If you plan to use portable electric space heaters, make sure to follow these tips and recommendations:

HEATER CHECKLIST

- Purchase a heater with the seal of a qualified testing laboratory.
- Keep the heater at least 3 feet (1 metre) away from anything that can burn, including people.
- Choose a heater with a thermostat and overheat protection.
- Place the heater on a solid, flat surface.
- Make sure your heater has an auto shut-off to turn the heater off if it tips over.
- Keep space heaters out of the way of foot traffic.
 Never block an exit.
- Keep children away from the space heater.
- Plug the heater directly into the wall outlet.
 Never use an extension cord.
- Space heaters should be turned off and unplugged when you leave the room or go to bed.

Types of electric space heaters

Oil or water-filled radiator Heated oil or water travels through the heater.

Fan-forced heater

A fan blows warm air over metal coils.

Ceramic heater

Air is warmed over a ceramic heating element.

Infrared heaters

Heat is created by infrared bulbs.

Fact

Two in five deaths in space heater fires involve portable electric space heaters.

Annual Tax Time

Tax invoices are available the first week of January 2026

Invoices will be mailed to all households during the first week of January. If you haven't received your tax bill, please contact ar@pcsp.ca

- Property owner(s) are responsible for ensuring the Town has their current mailing address on file.
- Property owner(s) are responsible for understanding their tax and interest obligations regardless of any error in the issuance of notification from the Town.
- Payment Deadline is March 31, 2026.
- Taxes not paid in full by the due date, are subject to a one percent (1%) simple interest rate which will be applied on the first day of every month.
- Accounts with a balance forward in January for the prior years' taxes, may be subject to collection measures, recovery and legal action.
- Accounts currently on a pre-authorized payment plan will automatically be re-calculated based on your current balance.
