


WELCOME TO VOISEY'S BROOK Management Unit

The Town of Portugal Cove - St. Philip's and the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador signed a **MUNICIPAL HABITAT STEWARDSHIP AGREEMENT** in June 2015. This agreement seeks to conserve important habitat for wildlife, known as Management Units. The MU's within the Town of Portugal Cove - St. Philip's cover approximately 919.8 acres of habitat and include Voisey's Brook, Blast Hole Ponds and several local rivers and streams.

Voisey's Brook
This Management Unit is approximately 42 hectares and is located northeast of Millers Pond. It is an expansion of Voisey's Brook Park, a popular and widely used recreational area.

The Town of Portugal Cove - St. Philip's is a leader in wildlife conservation in a chain of committed partners across North America. In eastern Canada, this partnership is known as the Eastern Habitat Joint Venture (EHJV).
